PROPERTY DESCRIPTION

Avenel MIDDLESEX COUNTY

Avenel is an unincorporated community and census-designated place located in Woodridge Township, in Middlesex County. According to the 2010 census, the population was 17011. Avenel has a total of 3.532 square miles.

Main Industries: Avenel was the flagship location of Bradco Supply, founded in 1966, one of the leading distributors of building supplies. Amazon.com opened a fulfillment center in June 2013.

Middlesex County is a county located in north-central New Jersey, United States. As of the 2017 Census estimate, the county's population was 842,798, making it the state's second-most populous county, an increase of 4.1% from the 2010 United States Census, when its population was enumerated at 809,858, making it the second-most populous county in the state. Middlesex is part of the New York metropolitan area, and its county seat is New Brunswick.

Education: The county is home to five colleges and universities, including: Middlesex County College, DeVry University, Rutgers University New Brunswick Campus, Rutgers University Biomedical and Health Sciences Campus, and Princeton University.

Geography: According to the 2010 Census, the county had a total area of 322.83 square miles (836.1 km2), including 308.91 square miles (800.1 km2) of land (95.7%) and 13.91 square miles (36.0 km2) of water (4.3%). The county is named after the historic English county of Middlesex.

Bisected by the Raritan River, the county is topographically typical of Central Jersey in that it is largely flat. The elevation ranges from sea level to 300 feet (91 m) above sea level on a hill scaled by Major Road/ Sand Hill Road near Route 1 in South Brunswick Township.

NEW JERSEY



New Jersey is a state in the Mid-Atlantic region of the Northeast United States. It is a peninsula, bordered on the north and east by the state of New York; on the east, southeast, and south by the Atlantic Ocean; on the west by the Delaware River and Pennsylvania; and on the southwest by the Delaware Bay and Delaware. New Jersey is the fourth-smallest state by area but the 11th-most populous, with 9 million residents as of 2017, and the most densely populated of theh 50 U.S. states. New Jersey lies entirely within the combined statistical areas of New York City and Philadelphia and is the third-wealthiest state by median household income as of 2016.



New Jersey was inhabited by Native Americans for more than 2,800 years, with historical tribes such as the Lenape along the coast. In the early 17th century, the Dutch and the Swedes made the first European settlements in the state. The English later seized control of the region, naming it the Province of New Jersey after the largest of the Channel Islands, Jersey, and granting it as a colony to Sir George Carteret and John Berkeley, 1st Baron Berkeley of Stratton. New Jersey was the site of several decisive battles during the American Revolutionary War in the 18th century.



In the 19th century, factories in cities, Camden, Paterson, Newark, Trenton, Jersey City, and Elizabeth helped to drive the Industrial Revolution. New Jersey's geographic location at the center of the Northeast megalopolis, between Boston and New York City to the northeast, and Philadelphia, Baltimore, and Washington D.C., to thesouthwest, fueled its rapid growth through the process of suburbanization began reverting with the consolidation of New Jersey's culturally diverse populace toward more urban settings with the state, with towns home to commuter rail stations outpacing the population growth of more automobile-oriented suburbs since 2008.
